#### CREATING A SAFER AND MORE MODERN CAMPUS - SUMMER 2022 CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

An estimated \$34.4 million of summer construction is underway in the Crete-Monee School District 201-U to create safer and enhanced teaching and learning spaces for our students and staff. Identified summer projects come from the district's short-term facility improvement plan and supports the District Strategic Plan goal to provide our students with equitable, safe, and well-maintained facilities.

Most of this summer's renovations are intended to address life safety needs (fire protection sprinkler systems, exhausts, unit ventilators), improve heating and cooling systems, introduce better and more cost effective lighting, and address electrical issues.



#### Here is a breakdown of improvements underway:

- Balmoral Elementary School Heating and Cooling System
- Coretta Scott King Magnet School Life Safety & Heating and Cooling System
- Crete Elementary School Life Safety & Heating and Cooling System
- Monee Education Center Life Safety & Heating and Cooling System
- Talala Elementary School Life Safety, Heating and Cooling System & Electrical Repair
- Early Learning Center Life Safety, Heating and Cooling System & Electrical Repair
- Crete-Monee High School Introduce LED Lighting

Other renovation projects slated for this summer include adding electronic signage and marquees throughout the district and new playground enhancements at the Early Learning Center. We are excited to share that construction will also begin in the fall on our new addition to Crete-Monee High School. The additional square footage will offer more space for the district to expand career and technical education opportunities for students.

All of these projects will be completed with long-term financing using working cash and funding bonds.



At its June 14 and June 21 meetings, the Crete-Monee Board of Education was presented with a proposed safety plan for the district's high school and middle school buildings for the 2022-23 school year.

Key components of the safety plan include a focus on developing relationships with students, partnering with law enforcement, and sharing information with other area Districts. The district will also emphasize better communication with families by sending out safety alerts in a more timely manner.

School and district administrators plan to maintain a strong presence through increased visibility in their respective buildings. They will continue conducting random locker searches and monitoring students' social media activity for any possible threats to school or student safety.

The Board approved using available grant funds to provide clear backpacks to all students in grades 2 through 12 this fall.

Additionally, on June 14, the Board discussed the prospect of installing metal detectors in each school, beginning with the high school, as an added safety precaution. The Board directed the Superintendent to survey students, staff, and community members on their opinions of adding metal detectors to schools.

After a Board member's request for data on metal detectors' effectiveness in schools on June 14, articles and information were shared at the June 21 meeting. The information presented the benefits and drawbacks of metal detectors, along with other information to consider before the Board makes a decision.

The surveys were open from June 27 to July 7. Results were then shared with the Board at its July 12 meeting. More than 80% of respondents said they believe metal detectors would be effective at protecting the safety and security of students, staff, and visitors.

The Board's discussions at the July regular meeting focused on piloting metal detectors at the high school first before pursuing them at the middle school. There were concerns brought up regarding the ability to staff the proposed eight detectors at the high school, along with other procedural questions.

Before a final decision is to be made, the Board directed the superintendent to reopen the survey just for staff once school reopened to obtain more targeted feedback from them. More discussion is expected at the September board meeting.

As the 2022-23 school year approaches, the Board and district will continue working together to strengthen safety practices within the Crete-Monee School District 201-U. District and school leaders will keep parents, students, staff, and community members informed as updates take place.

#### **GOALS FOR THE COMING SCHOOL YEAR**

We are committed to learning and growing along with our students. Here's what we're looking forward to in the 2022-23 school year as we continue our strategic planning initiative:

This year, we will continue to focus on professional development by emphasizing coaching and peer observations to deliver equitable instruction which engages students in learning. We'll also work to establish aligned standards impacting student assessments and curriculum planning to achieve equity and bolster collaboration.

We recognize that everyone comes from a unique background, with diverse skills and talents. Our goal is to foster an inclusive and respectful environment while establishing a system of academic and behavioral support. In the coming school year, we'll be focusing on creating trauma support programs and identifying the skill sets that help students successfully transition to the next stage of their academic careers.

We will work with our certified and noncertified staff to create a plan for targeted annual professional development based on staff's selfidentified needs. This process leads to a collaborative culture of collective inquiry, action, research, and continuous improvement. We will develop professional learning pathways for certified staff to gain valuable additional experience as teachers and learners. Educators understand the impact family and communities can have on a student's education. One of our priorities for 2022-23 is to continue our collaboration with the Crete-Monee Educational Foundation.

Our students and staff should feel safe at school within a well-maintained learning environment. We will leverage our shortterm maintenance plan to address our aging facilities by adding air conditioning, pipes for accessible water. and other such upgrades. We will enhance our safety policies and procedures to include clear backpack usage for all students in grades 2-12. frequent locker searches in the upper grades, and increased partnerships with our community resources.

School funding can be a challenge, which is why we aim to prioritize limited resources for the most impactful results. We will continue to monitor the budgets for capital projects and facilities improvements, as well as maintain our annual reviews of contracts and agreements to ensure optimal return on investment.

Over the coming school year, we expect to make even more progress on these six major goals. We would like to thank our hardworking staff, educators, students, and families. Your support and advocacy helps us create a better learning environment for all.
